A NeedleKnowledge® Quilt Pattern

Before Beginning...

- ◆ Carefully read the instructions before starting the project
- ◆ Pre-wash and press all fabrics before cutting. Replace any fabrics that continue to bleed after washing
- ◆ All seam allowances are 1/4 inch and are included in the given measurements
- ◆ Press seams as you work, and always press towards the darker fabrics whenever possible. Small pieces can be finger-pressed to save trips to the ironing board
- ◆ Be sure to follow the printing instructions on the last page

Every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of this pattern. We cannot, however, be responsible for human error, typographical mistakes, improper printer settings and variations, or variations in an individual's work.

Step 3 - Cut and Assemble the Star Blocks:

These blocks are used at the corners of the inner area.

From the pale gold fabric cut sixteen (16) aa pieces. Reverse the pattern and cut an additional sixteen (16) aa pieces (in reverse) from the deep gold fabric. From the deep blue fabric cut sixteen (16) Y squares and sixteen (16) bb triangles.

Set in one bb triangle between one pale gold aa piece and one deep gold aa piece to make the star units. Make 16 of these units (Fig. 4).

Stitch four of the star units with 4 of the blue Y squares to make a block. Make 4 of these blocks (Fig. 5).



Sadly, this information must be placed here...

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TIP: Patterns for the set-in pieces, such as the bb and aa pieces have a dot in the seam line where intersecting seam allowances converge. When setting in these pieces, stitch just to the circles indicated on the pattern pieces. This allows for pucker-free set-in seams. Do not stitch into the intersecting seam allowances!

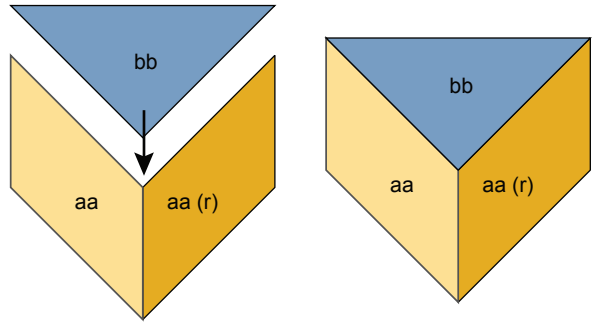

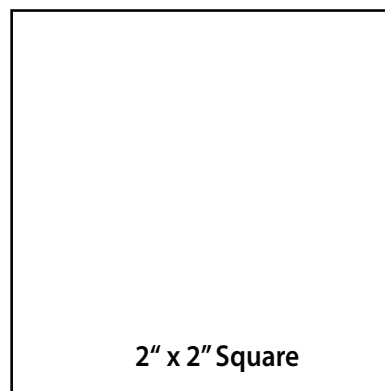
How to Print the Patterns:

It is extremely important that you follow these printing instructions properly. Otherwise, your printer may not print the full-size patterns to the proper size!

Most printers default to scaling in order to print what it deems to be "too large" for an area. This feature must be disabled by un-clicking or un-selecting the feature.

Please note that while these instructions work for most printers, there is a possibility that your printer may vary. To double-check the sizing, measure the square shown below. It should measure 2" x 2" square.

- ◆ Paper Size is 8.5 x 11 letter, set to portrait,, not landscape
- ◆ Print Quality should be set to "Normal"
- ◆ Do not use any form of Page Scaling - this option should be set to "NONE"
- ◆ The Auto Rotate to Center should NOT be checked. Un-check this box.
- ◆ Do NOT use the "Choose Paper Source by PDF Page Size" Box
- ◆ Do NOT use the "Fit to Printable Area" option
- ◆ Do NOT use the "Shrink to Printable Area" option
- ◆ If your printer has an advanced setting named "Features", this setting should be set to "Print Actual Size"
- ◆ Refer to your printer's Owner's Manual for additional information
